Trauma Military Intermediate Life Support (TMILS) Course Description

TMILS is provided by Pro Deo International through the faculty of Medical Emergency Education. Train in military casualty care with the new TMILS program that combines the fundamentals of TILS trauma assessment and treatment with recent military innovations utilized in the world's current combat zones.

The demands and limitations of providing effective trauma care in a combat situation necessitate special adaptations of trauma assessment and treatment used in the civilian medical system. TMILS adapts proven techniques taught in the civilian TILS course to the military environment where limited resources are the rule, not the exception. The TMILS, is developed for military medical providers from medics to physicians, incorporating new aspects in Medical Trauma. The military-based scenarios are customised for the challenges faced by military personnel.

Theoretical and Practical Evaluation

This course combine classroom learning and hands-on practical stations. Scenario assessment will enable the trainee to be able to input his/her learning to work in trauma situations. The courses provide complete training in the skills needed for rapid assessment, resuscitation, stabilization, and transportation of trauma patients.
